In each unit, skills spiral in modules 2 - 4 as students go through the writing process three times; in module 5, students choose a piece of writing to publish

Writing Instruction/Implementation

1 Writing Community Unit; 3 Genre/Process Units (Opinion, Informative, Narrative)

Five Modules in each Genre/Process Unit:

- Module 1 is genre study
- Modules 2-4 increase in rigor and take students through the writing process
- Module 5 is publish, present, and self-reflect

Lessons within modules align with the writing process. Students go through the writing process 4 times within a Unit (12 times over the course of the program).
