

Walk on eggshells


Definition: to be careful not to upset someone or something

Definition: in a difficult situation


Isabelle was **in a pickle** when she forgot that she made plans with two friends on the same day.

On the first day of summer vacation, life was just a bowl of cherries for Ashlyn.




Spill the beans

Definition: to share information that is secret


Brady **spilled the beans** about Ada's surprise party when he showed her the invitation.
